# BOARD Retreat




Members of the Board enjoyed a fun weekend of planning and bonding time at the Tumlin House in Dahlonega. They are ready to take on a successful and fun year!

# what is SPAC?

The purpose of SPAC (State Public Affairs Committee) is to select state and national issues that support League projects, educate individual member Leagues on issues selected for action by SPAC, facilitate communication among the member Junior Leagues of Georgia in the area of public affairs, provide training in advocacy skills and strategies, and act as the representative of the member Leagues on the state and national levels. Most recently, Georgia SPAC has backed HB 8 which works to remove tax on women's menstrual products.

**What is Thrift Sale?** Thrift Sale is our big event of the League year and is one of the longest standing fundraisers around, celebrating its 56th anniversary this year. It's an exciting time where Active members and Sustainers come together to provide a great service to our community.

### What are my member responsibilities?

- Each *Active* and *Provisional* member of the League is responsible for working a total of 12 hours leading up to or during Thrift Sale plus quota. See Co-Chairs for questions on these requirements.
- *Active Members:* Please include with your quota 20 plastic bags, one roll of masking tape, and one black Sharpie.
- *New Members:* Please include with your quota one roll of packing tape and a case of water.

### *Take note!*

This year we have restructured Thrift Sale and no longer have committees. Our goal for the new structure is to create requirements that are obtainable for the working woman. It allows members to choose the obligations that best meet their busy lifestyle. This will encourage members to embrace their individual gifts and passions within the Thrift Sale framework and hopefully make a positive change that allows our members to flourish.

- Move-in Day Shift
- Sustainer Coffee

- General Work Shifts

### **How much in quota do I need?**

Each Active and New member of the League is responsible for pricing and bringing **\$150 worth of quota/merchandise** to the Civic Center during sale week (**deadline is Tuesday, Oct. 1 by 6:00pm**). Your quota sheet must be turned in and checked upon drop off.

### **How do I price my quota?**

Pricing sheets can be found at [www.gainesvillehalljuniorleague.org](http://www.gainesvillehalljuniorleague.org). The pricing sheet should be used as a guide to price your items. Please price your items **BEFORE** you turn in your quota by using a black Sharpie marker to write the price on a piece of masking tape.

**Adult clothing does not have to be priced.**

### **What about clothing?**

We are happy to accept adult and children's clothing, however the quota rules are different for each.

### **Do you accept books?**

We ARE accepting **children's** books this year. However, they do not need to be priced.

### **What other items are not accepted?**

We **DO NOT** accept the following items:

Undergarments, bathing suits, car seats, knives, mattresses, plastic food containers, stuffed animals, adult books, shoes, or items worth less than \$0.25.

Each piece of children's clothing is priced at \$.50 each. The children's clothing needs to be in good condition, with minimal stains and gently used.

“The Georgia Mountain Food Bank works as a community convener to address food insecurity. We look for solutions through traditional and non-traditional partnerships at a local, state, regional, and national level. We regularly share best practices and service models with other communities. We recently had two occasions to talk about our work with the Junior League of Gainesville- Hall County, one of our 70 traditional agency partners. At recent hunger meetings organized by the Georgia Food Bank Association, we proudly spoke about the model and how it was formed to support school food pantries and family resource clients. By working through a traditional partner, we found a solution to serve children and families in a non-traditional Food Bank scenario. 
